

City Council Meeting, July 8, 2015

The Fayetteville City Council met in regular session on July 8, 2015 at 7:00 P.M. in the Community Center Meeting Room. Those present to witness were Mayor Pro Tem Steve Pavlicek, Councilpersons Marino, Malota and Gillespie, plus visitors. Mayor Ron Pflughaupt was absent.

Mayor Pro Tem Pavlicek called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag and declared a quorum was present. Mayor Pro Tem Pavlicek welcomed the visitors.

The Council approved the April 29, 2015 special called meeting and June 10, 2015 regular meeting minutes as presented.

The treasurer's report was next on the agenda. The report showed a balance of \$32,190.49 in the General Fund and \$46,339.56 in the Systems Fund. A motion was made by Councilperson Malota, seconded by Councilman Marino, that Council approve the treasurer's report as presented. Motion carried.

Bills were presented to Council to review next on the agenda. After reviewing the bills, a motion was made by Councilman Marino, seconded by Councilperson Malota, that Council approve payment of June 2015 bills and the usual bills that come in late. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Councilman Marino, seconded by Councilperson Malota, that Council approve the Fayetteville Knights of Columbus using the parking lot next to the old Fire Station on Saturday, July 18, 2015, from 7 A.M. to 1 P.M. for the annual blood drive. Motion carried.

Linda Cushing addressed Council to be considered to fill the vacant position on City Council. No action was taken at this time.
